At the Swinburne BabyLab we study how babies see and think about their world, particularly during the first years of life.



Here are some of the issues that we are investigating:

- How babies recognize faces and objects
- Why they pay attention to some things and not others
- How their language and understanding of the world develops
- How they learn to understand what other people do and think

Research has discovered that adults with schizophrenia show differences in some of these mental activities. Are such differences observable in babies of parents with schizophrenia? The answer to this question could lead to a better understanding of schizophrenia and how to manage it.
